Rillis are made from scraps of cotton fabric hand dyed to the desired color. A typical rilli is about seven by four or five feet. Much of the fabric comes from old, worn shalwar kameez (traditional loose shirt and pant outfits). The most common colors in rillis are white, black, red, yellow, orange, green, dark blue and purple.

With 176 pages and hundreds of color photographs of the area and the rallis, it covers both the background of the quilts, socially and historically, as well as the designs and techniques of making the rallis.

Traditionally, there are three styles of ralli quilting: patchwork, applique and embroidered. Patchwork is based on colored fabric cut into geometric shapes and stitched together, applique designs are made from cut fabric sewn to another cloth, and embroidered quilts use embroidery as a method to both decorate and hold the quilts together.
